



**One Week Island Hopper and Mileage
Building Week
Antigua to Dominica and Return
Sunday, January 19 to Sunday, January 26, 2025**

8 days - 7 nights, Sailing the Leeward Islands of the Lesser Antilles
Antigua – Guadeloupe – Iles Des Saints – Dominica - Antigua

Day 1 Antigua, Jolly Harbour

After arrival at the V. C. Bird International Airport, a 25-minute taxi ride will deliver you to Jolly Harbour Marina where you will meet your Captain. A cold tropical beverage awaits your arrival aboard Lady Nathalie. Following a quick tour, you will participate in a short security and safety briefing. Time to unwind, relax and settle into the yacht. The captain will review the itinerary for the week. Dinner will be ashore at one of the many fine restaurants in Jolly Harbour.

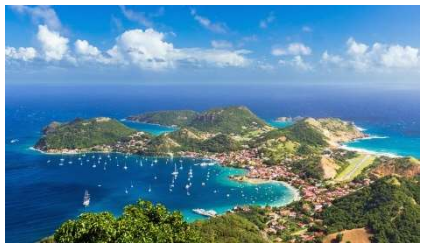


Day 2 Deshaies, Guadeloupe - 50 Miles

An early start for the sail south to the French island of Guadeloupe. With breakfast and fresh ground coffee served enroute. Your first anchorage will be the pretty fishing village of Deshaies. Home to where the UK TV series “Death in Paradise” is filmed. This fun town offers a host of French cafés and boutiques.

Day 3 Iles Des Saints, Guadeloupe – 35 Miles

On the way to Les Saintes, we will stop at Pigeon Island, home of the famous Jacques Cousteau’s Marine Reserve, with some of the best snorkeling in the Caribbean. Iles des Saintes is an island just south of Basse Terre. The anchorage is at Anse de Bourg on Terre de Haut. Explore Fort Napoleon for some history of the islands and stunning views across the bays.



Day 4 and 5 Plymouth, Dominica – 20 Miles

Dominica has mountainous beauty and is largely covered by rain forest with many waterfalls, springs and rivers. Dominica is home to the world's second-largest hot spring, Boiling Lake, and exotic plants and animals. It is an island well worth exploring. We will spend two days here giving lots of time to explore the island.

Day 6 Falmouth Harbour, Antigua – 98 Miles

Today will be a day at sea starting with a predawn departure. Everyone will have lots of time on the helm and experience the serenity of night sailing under a starlit sky, arriving in Falmouth Harbour after midnight.



Day 7 English Harbour, Antigua – 2 nm

English Harbour, located just around the corner from Falmouth, is one of the most picturesque harbours in the world. It is well worth exploring Nelson's Dockyard, which is a restored 18th century working dockyard. In days gone by, Nelson would keep his fleet here. There is a museum dedicated to his memory and has some fascinating exhibits. Nelson's Dockyard is now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. A relaxing dinner will be on shore tonight, allowing ample time to relax and reminisce about the fabulous week of adventure around these beautiful Caribbean islands.

Day 8 Jolly Harbour - 15 nm

After breakfast, we set sail back to Jolly Harbour where it's time to say goodbye to the Captain and your Caribbean vacation, rejuvenated for your flight back home.
